
# **B&B** Data Structure

# 1. The Strucutre of the Project's Database

All data from the various libraries will be mapped on to a set of related database tables. The fields marked above with a red asterisk will be mapped onto 'core' fields in the database. Core fields will be available across all libraries and will generally be searchable in the project's online resource. Such a field may have a different label or structure in the source data for different libraries, but will be stored in a consistent manner in the project's database for all libraries where the field appears. For example, 'Folio number' is labelled variously as 'Folio number', 'Folio No', 'Page Num', 'Page Number' and 'Page' and appears in different columns across the source data, but all these will be mapped onto a single 'Folio number' column in the project's database.

Any fields that only appear in one or two libraries, or are not well populated may not be assigned as a 'core' field but instead may be stored as 'additional fields'. Additional fields are associated with a single library only and are used to augment the core set of fields where necessary. The field may be an additional field relating to the borrowing record, the borrower or the book. The data structure will enable any number of additional fields to be added for any current or future library, and such fields will generally only be displayed on the project's online resource rather than included in any search facilities.

Below is a diagram representing the structure of the project's database. Note that '1...N' denotes a 'one to many' relationship (e.g. one library has many ledgers and each ledger is related to one library) while 'M...N' denotes a 'many to many' relationship (e.g. a borrower may have many occupations and each occupation may be related to many borrowers).



A discussion of the tables, relationships and fields contained within the the tables is given below. Tables are listed as blue headings and their fields appear as purple text. Each field is given a description and the corresponding field names in the sample datasets are also given where applicable. Note that any fields denoted as free-text will enable HTML formatting to be recorded and any 'Editor's Notes' fields will not be publically accessible.

## Library

This table contains the data about a library and the following fields will be recorded:

## **Library ID**

• Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

# Library name

 Description: The principal name of the library, as used to identify the library by users of the site

## Name variants

• Description: A free-text field for recording other names the library has been known by and any associated dates

## Settlement

• Description: The name of the settlement the library is located in, for display alongside the library name in the front-end

### **Address**

Description: A free-text field where the full address of the library can be entered

#### **Address variants**

Description: A free-text field for recording other addresses the library may have had

#### Latitude

 Description: The latitude of the library's current location, for use in any map-based visualisations

## Longitude

 Description: The longitude of the library's current location, for use in any map-based visualisations

#### URL

• Description: The URL of the library's current website

#### **Foundation date**

 Description: The date when the library was founded, recorded as YYYY-MM-DD, YYYY-MM or YYYY as data allows

## Library type

 Description: A fixed list of library types from which one can be chosen, e.g. Subscription, Institutional

### **Library description**

• Description: A free-text field for an essay about the library, which may include a general description, historical information, descriptions of historic catalogues, successor libraries, and other information.

## **Borrower description**

Description: A free-text field for a description of the borrowers associated with the library

## **Collection information**

 Description: A fixed list of options to describe the collection, from which one can be chosen, e.g. Still in situ, dispersed and lost, moved elsewhere. Note further information (e.g. where the collection was moved to), should be supplied using the following free-text field

### **Holding description**

Description: A free-text field for describing the holdings and the collection

## Modern catalogue

• Description: The URL of the corresponding modern catalogue, if available

## Sources outside period

Description: A free-text field for describing sources outside the period, if applicable

## **Secondary sources**

Description: A free-text field for listing secondary sources that deal with the library

### **Editor's notes**

Description: a free-text field where the RA can enter notes about the library if required

### **Available Sources**

This table features information about the types of sources that are available at a specific library. Information will consist of a type of source (e.g. accessions records) and an optional short description of the source. A library may have multiple rows for each applicable source type. Note that where a library does not have a source type this information will not be recorded as it can be inferred from the absence of the record. The table will feature the following fields:

Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

#### Source type

Description: The type of source, selected from a list containing the following options:
 Accessions records; De-accessions records; Requests books; Subscription lists; Matriculation records; Blot books; Other

## **Source description**

Description: A short free-text description about this source

## Ledger

This table contains information about the ledger or register book that contains pages of borrowing records. A ledger must be associated with one library and can have any number of pages. The following fields will be featured:

Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

• Description: The ID of the library the ledger belongs to

## **Ledger Volume**

- Description: The name given to the ledger (e.g. Vol. 3)

 Description: Type of ledger, selected from a list containing options such as 'Professorial, Student, Town'

### **Editor's notes**

 Description: a free-text field where the RA can enter notes about the borrowing record if required

## Page

This table contains information about a specific page in the ledger. A page must be part of a single ledger and may contain any number of borrowing records. Also contained in the table are a reference to the digitsed image of the page and the IDs of the next and previous pages in sequence to facilitate navigation in the front-end.

### Page ID

• Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

### **Ledger ID**

• Description: The ID of the ledger the page belongs to

#### **Folio Number**

Description: The page number the record is found on, e.g. '1r'

## **Borrowing**

This table contains all of the data about a specific borrowing, which must be associated with a single library via a page in a ledger. A borrowing may be associated with one or more book item records, as a borrowing may involve multiple volumes of a book. A borrowing may be associated with multiple borrowers as one location includes information about 'other readers', but generally a borrowing record will only be associated with a single borrower. The table will feature the following fields:

#### Borrower

This table contains all of the data about borrowers that are associated with borrowing records. Each identifyable borrower is stored only once and can then be associated with multiple borrowing records by means of the BorrowerBorrowing table described below. Note however that a borrower record can only be related to borrowings from a single library. If a borrower from one library is thought to be the same as a borrower at another then a borrower record must be created for each library and these can then be associated with each other via the Borrower Xref table described below.

Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

# **Library ID**

Description: Although the library ID can be inferred from the relationship between a
borrower and a borrowing and then from a borrowing to a library via the page and ledger
tables, the library ID will also be stored directly in the borrower table to simplify querying.
Note that the relationship between borrower and library is not shown on the above
diagram.

# BorrowerBorrowing

This is a joining table between the borrower and borrowing tables and enables a borrowing record to be associated with multiple borrowers and a borrower to be associated with multiple borrowing records. Generally a borrowing record will only have a single borrower, but one location in the sample data (Haddington) also records 'other readers' for a borrowing record and this structure allows these to be stored. The table will contain the following fields:

### **Borrowing ID**

Description: The ID of the borrowing record

## **Borrower ID**

• Description: The ID of the borrower record

## **Type**

• Description: Can be either main or other

## **Borrower Xref**

This is a joining table between different borrower records that may be associated with the same or a different library. A borrower record may be associated with any number of other borrower records, and the connection between records will be automatically bidirectional (i.e. when recording a connection between Borrower A and Borrower B a connection between Borrower B and Borrower A does not also need to be manually recorded). A brief description of the association may also be entered. The table will contain the following fields:

### **Xref ID**

Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

## **From ID**

Description: The ID of the borrower record the cross-reference is coming from

## To ID

• Description: The ID of the borrower record the cross-reference is going to

## **Xref Description**

• Description: A short free-text field where the nature of the cross reference can be entered (e.g. 'is thought to be the same person as' or 'is the son of'). Note that when the text is displayed in the front-end the borrower specified by the 'From ID' will always appear before the description and the borrower specified by the 'To ID' will always appear after, e.g. whether viewing the record for Borrower A or Borrower B the cross-reference would read 'Borrower A is thought to be the same person as Borrower B'.

## Occupation

There are several fields in the original data that contain information about occupations. These will all be amalgamated and each distinct occupation will be stored once in this table with the following fields:

## **Book Work**

This table will contain over-arching records for each book in the system (e.g. Hume's History of England). There are four levels of book record in the system and this is the top-level record. It will be possible to find all individual versions of a book work across all libraries using this structure. The table will feature the following fields:

• Description: A unique auto-incrementing ID for the book work

• Description: A standardised title for the book work

• Description: Either a single year (YYYY) or a range (YYYY-YYYY)

# Circa

• A yes/no field for whether the date is circa or not

• Description: a free-text field where the RA can enter notes about the Book Work if required

## **Book Edition**

This table contains information about a specific bibliographic edition of a work. Each work may have multiple editions and each edition must have a single over-arching book work record. The table will feature the following fields:

#### **Book Edition ID**

• Description: A unique auto-incprementing ID for the book edition

#### **Book Work ID**

• Description: The ID of the corresponding entry in the Book Work table

## **Title**

• Description: The title of the edition

## **ESTC Number**

 Description: The unique English Short Title Catalogue number, which will enable linking through to the ESTC system

# Other authority URL

Description: The URL for an alternative authority record for the book edition

# Other authority type

 Description: The type of authority record the URL links to, taken from a fixed list of authorities such as WorldCat, CERL

### Language

Description: The language of the book

 Description: A free-text box where information about translators of the edition can be entered, if applicable

## **Editor's notes**

Description: a free-text field where the RA can enter notes about the Edition if required

# **Book Holding**

This table contains data about specific library records of books. It is at this level that a book record is associated with an individual library. Although the associated library can be inferred from the relationship between book holding and book item, then book item and borrowing, then borrowing and library via the page and ledger tables, a direct connection between each book holding record and its corresponding library will also be recorded in this table to streamline querying. Note that this relationship is not included in the above diagram. Note also that a book holding may be associated with multiple book editions in cases of collective binding therefore a separate joining table is required between the book holding and book edition tables (see BookHoldingBookEdition below). Fields relating to books as found in the source material are located in this table. The following fields are included:

## BookHoldingBookEdition

This is a joining table between the Book Holding and Book Edition tables and is required as an edition may have multiple holdings (e.g. in different libraries) and a holding may be comprised of multiple editions (e.g. in the case of collective binding). In addition to containing the IDs of the respective holdings and editions, this table also includes a confidence level field, which records how certain the RA is that the holding is related to the edition in question:

### **Book Holding ID**

Description: The ID of the book holding

#### **Book Edition ID**

• Description: The ID of the book edition

#### Confidence level

• Description: The level of confidence the RA has that the holding represents the edition in question. Can be one of: Certain; Likely; Probable; Speculative

# **Book Item**

This table is the individual codex of a holding. A book holding may have multiple book items if it consists of multiple volumes, but in most cases a book holding will only have a single book item. The table will contain the following fields:

#### **Book Item ID**

Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

## **Book Holding ID**

• Description: The ID of the corresponding Book Holding record

## **Part Number**

• Description: The part number of the item (e.g. Volume IV), if applicable

## BookItemBorrowing

This joining table establishes the link between a borrowing record and a book. A joining table is required as a book item may be associated with multiple borrowing records and a borrowing record may refer to multiple book items (e.g. Volumes I-III). The table will consist of the IDs of the Book Item and Borrowing tables:

#### **Book Item ID**

Description: The ID of the book item that is being borrowed

### **Borrowing ID**

Description: The ID of the borrowing record

## **Author**

This table contains information about book authors. Authors are recorded only once in the system and can then be associated wih multiple books at any level (Work, Edition, Holding, Item). These

relationships are stored in a separate joining table as an author may be associated with multuiple books and a book may have multiple authors. The main author table will contain the following fields:

#### **Author ID**

Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

#### **Author title**

• Description: The author's title, if applicable

#### **Author forename**

• Description: The author's forename

#### **Author surname**

• Description: The author's surname

#### **Author other titles**

• Description: Any titles that appear after an author's name

#### Date of birth

Description: Date of birth as YYYY/MM/DD, if known

#### **Birth Circa**

• A yes/no field for whether the date is circa or not

## Date of death

• Description: Date of death as YYYY/MM/DD, if known

### **Death Circa**

• A yes/no field for whether the date is circa or not

## **Editor's notes**

Description: a free-text field where the RA can enter notes about the author if required

#### **AuthorBook**

This table documents the association between an author and a book at any level (Work, Edition, Holding, Item). In addition, an alias field is included to enable the recording of the author's name as it appears in the book if this differs from the canonical name found in the corresponding author record. Note that an associated author will automatically cascade from the associated book level to all lower levels. E.g. if Author A is associated with the Work entry for Book B then this association will be automatically visible when viewing Editions, Holdings or Items that are associated with the Work. However, specifying an author at a lower level will automatically replace the higher level author from the point of replacement downwards. E.g. Author A is associated with the Work entry for Book B and Book B has two Editions (C and D). If Edition C introduces a second author X then two new entries in the AuthorBook table would be needed, associating Edition C with both Author A and

Author X. Both authors would then be associated with any Holdings and Items that connect to Edition C while Edition D would continue to have the single author A. Where an author's name changes at a lower level than the initial connection between author and book a similar process would be required. The table will contain the following fields:

#### **AuthorBook ID**

• Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

### **Author ID**

• Description: The ID of the author that is to be associated with the book

### **Book ID**

• Description: The ID of the book that is to be associated with the author

#### **Book Table**

 Description: The book table that the record identified by the Book ID is located in. Either Book Work, Book Edition, Book Holding or Book Item

#### **Author Alias**

• Description: The author's name as it appears in this book, if it differs from the form found in the Author table

### Genre

This table contains the genre and subject tags from two of the sample datasets and will be extended to cover all books. The current structure enables multiple genres to be applied to each Book Edition. The following fields will be included:

### **Genre ID**

• Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

### Title

Description: The genre title

## GenreBookEdition

This joining table connects the Genre and Book Edition tables and enables a book to have multiple genres and a genre to be applied to multiple books. The following two columns will be included:

### **Genre ID**

• Description: The ID of the required genre

### **Book ID**

• Description: The ID of the Book Edition

### AdditionalField

The data from each location may include fields that do not match up to any of the 'core' fields listed above. This table holds information about each of these fields. The structure is listed below and the fields that will be created for the sample data (noted with a green asterisk in the first section of this document) are listed in the following section.

This table contains the actual data for each additional field. Each row must be associated with one row in the AdditionalField table and (depending on the type) one row in either the 'borrowing', 'book holding' or 'borrower' table.

## AdditionalFieldData ID

• Description: An auto-incrementing unique numerical identifier

# AdditionalField ID

 Description: A link to the AdditionalField table that establishes what sort of data the field contains

## **Row ID**

 Description: A link to a specific row in either the 'borrowing', 'book holding' or 'borrower' table depending on the 'type' specified in the AdditionalField table, thus establishing exactly which record has the additional piece of data

#### **Value**

• Description: The additional piece of data to be stored.

# 2. Fields found in the original data

This section lists all of the fields found in the sample data files from five locations. These will be mapped onto a project-wide data schema that is defined in Section 1. **Note:** A red asterisk (\*) denotes a field that will be mapped onto a core field in the database as described in the preceding section, while a green asterisk (\*) denotes a field that will be stored as an 'additional field'.
